Policemen See UFO ^{on 10/23}

RANDOLPH TWP. — Two local policemen last night spotted an unidentified flying object over the Dover-Chester Road near the Sussex Turnpike intersection.

Sergeant Michael Luzun and Patrolman Leslie Mills reported seeing the UFO while on patrol driving along the Dover Chester Road northward near South Road at 8:45.

Mills said the object was "oval shaped, bright and yellowish" and was similar to a saucer he spotted near High Point last August.

He said it was about one-quarter to a half-mile ahead of the patrol car approaching slowly from the west about 200 to 300 feet above the ground.

It sped off when the police turned the patrol car spot light toward it, Mills said.

Two Police Sight UFO

RANDOLPH Twp. — Two policemen on patrol in Ironia saw an unidentified flying object move slowly over the woods west of Dover-Chester Road for about ten minutes last night.

The two were Sgt. Michael Lizun, who has never seen a U.F.O. before, and Ptl. Leslie Mills, who had seen once before at High Point State Park.

Ptl. Mills gave this account.

He and Sgt. Lizun were driving north on Dover-Chester Road in the vicinity of South Road when they saw an oval-shaped amber object moving over the woods towards the road.

"We stopped the car and got out to take a look," Ptl. Mills said. "It wasn't very far above

the treetop level — 300 feet at most, and it was at least as big as a car. It moved slowly, no more than 30-40 miles an hour."

The edges of the object were indistinct, and it was uniform in color — not traffic light orange but a yellow-orange or amber. It made no noise that the policemen could hear, but could be seen quite clearly.

As it approached the road, Ptl. Mills shined the patrol car's spotlight at the object, which thereupon, without turning, reversed direction and headed back westward. "It seemed to go down into the woods near Greenhut Park," he reported. The object had been in view about 10 minutes, starting 8:46 p.m.

'Saucers' In Randolph

 RANDOLPH TWP. — Police here last night answered to the second "flying saucer" complaint in less than a year, as residents in the Oak Drive area reported seeing "several objects hovering, splitting up, and going in different directions."

A woman, who wished to remain unidentified, told police last night that she saw the UFOs, Unidentified Flying Objects, at about 10 p.m. Other witnesses attested to her story but by the time police arrived the "saucers" were gone.

Randolph Township saucers are not a new thing. Last Oct. 23 two policemen, Sergeant Michael Luzan and Patrolman Leslie Mills, reported seeing one near the Dover-Chester Road. "They were bright, oval-shaped and yellowish in color," Patrolman Mills reported at the time.

The cops said the UFO was about one-quarter to one-half mile ahead of their patrol car and approaching slowly from the west about 200 feet from the ground. Then Sergeant Luzan turned on the spotlight, the UFO sped off.

The last time flying saucers were reported in the area was last month when a Rockaway Township housewife, Mrs. Charles Weimer Jr., who lives at St. Bernard's and Richard Mills roads, said that she saw a "strange object" over the Mound Hope area at about 8:30 p.m.

"It was quite high in the sky but I could see that it was round," she later told township police who had received several other calls about the UFO.

"It had four very bright lights and it didn't make any noise," he added.
