UFO Is Afraid Of Light

An Unidentified Flying Object "flew away without a sound" when DuPage County police deputies turned their spotlights on it in amazement early Saturday near Itasca.

But they're sure it was an actual UFO.

DuPage Capt. Jack Fisher declares the last local official sighting was about 10 years ago near Glen Ellyn.

DEPUTIES Raymond Richards and Joseph Volencic said they spotted the UFO while on patrol near Illinois 53 and Thorndale Road about 3:30 a.m. It was cigar-shaped, about 100 feet long, with four small white lights, one red light and two stubby wings.

It hovered above the area at about 1,000-foot altitude.

The DuPage sheriff's office doesn't know what it was, but they know now it doesn't like being in the spotlight.


Gentlemen:
