

1977: nr. Lithgow, NSW
CEI w. fog patch

NA 77001. 4th January 1977. 2130. CEI. UFO Research (NSW)

On wednesday night, the 4-1-77, a man aged 20 and his girlfriend were returning from holidays along the Bell Line road near Lithgow NSW, heading east towards Sydney. At 9.30 p.m., about 5 miles from Lithgow, they sighted a huge orange glow in the distance and first thought may have been a bushfire. After a few minutes, the glow appeared to be moving overhead and towards the passenger side of the car. It appeared to be a huge circular diffuse glow which was confined to its own parameters. Their vehicle had by now become enveloped in a large fog patch estimated to be at least 300 feet across, which remained with them until the glow had passed by. The glow was described as being orange-yellow in colour and more intense towards the centre. The night was dark with extensive cloud cover and the full moon was barely visible. The glow was then observed to recede into the distance. The entire event lasted 10 minutes.
