Panel Of Critics Of Condon Report Set In Denver

Six scientists who disagree with the conclusions of the Condon report on unidentified flying objects will take part in a panel discussion of UFO's during the National Amateur Astronomers convention in Denver in August.

Those taking part will be Dr. James A. Harder, University of California — Berkeley civil engineering professor; Dr. J. Allen Hyneck, director, Lindheimer Astronomical Research Center, Northwestern University; Dr. James E. McDonald, senior physicist, University of Arizona Institute of Atmospheric Physics; Dr. Frank B. Salisbury, head, plant science department, Utah State University; Dr. David R. Saunders, psychology professor, University of Colorado and former investigator for the study headed by Dr. E. U. Condon; and Dr. R. Leo Sprinkle, counselor, University of Wyoming.

All the speakers are expected to say something on how they feel science should approach the problem of UFO phenomena in the future.

The panel discussion will be held Aug. 22. A limited number of tickets will be available to the general public and will be offered for sale a week before the vent.
